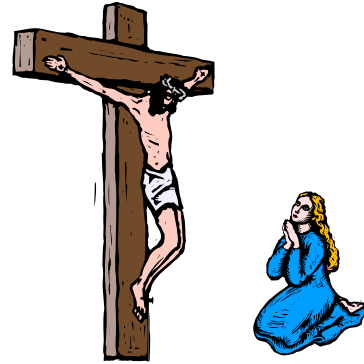

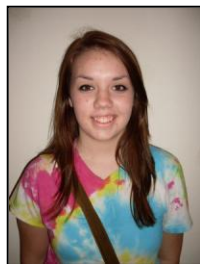

Such was the case when a swell of courage and determination came into the heart of Nu-Elm resident Rebecca West, as she witnessed a near riot (resulting in violence and injury) take place on a warm Sunday afternoon last October. Rebecca had lived at Nu-Elm for 7 years and had grown tired of the drug dealing, drug using, hostile environment that had been common place on or near the property for years. In short order she enlisted her neighbors, and with the cooperation and help of Apartment Management and Springfield Police, organized a very effective Neighborhood Watch. She also set up monthly meetings and in partnership with Lifebuilders, started to have frequent community events. With proper reporting in place the management was able to document more resident guideline violations and evict those causing problems. You should see the peace and order that prevails on the property now... a totally different atmosphere! Rebecca is a strong Christian and a vital participant in all Lifebuilders services at Nu-Elm, and to think she did all of this while suffering from a serious shoulder injury, job change, loss of income, and financial hardship. “Becky we are so proud of you. Our hats are off to you.” Now let the rest of us be sure that we continue TO HELP HER and not let the “guard down”!



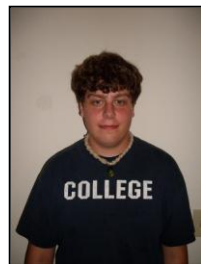

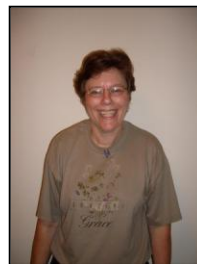

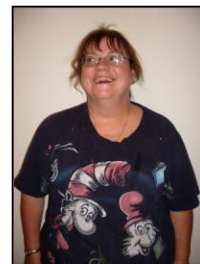
